Organization/Agency	Program Description
Job Opportunities Task Force, Baltimore Metro Chapter of ABC and IEC Partnership	JOTF offers courses, which include intake, referral for GED completion, employment counseling, resume writing and job placement. They also offer a Pre-Apprenticeship Program (JumpStart) that prepares students to enter the building trades in the areas of electrical, carpentry or plumbing and Apprenticeship Programs in the carpentry, electrical, HVAC/R, pipe fitting, plumbing, sprinkler fitting and sheet metal trades.
Community College of Baltimore County	CCBC offers courses, which include basic financial literacy, computers, and basic supervisory and personal leadership skills. They also offer Pre-Apprenticeship Programs that teach general construction skills, electrical, carpentry and plumbing. Professional Services programs also are offered in the fields of Surveyor, Appraiser and Right of Way Agents.
Community College of Baltimore City	CCBC provides courses which include Literacy, Pre-GED, GED, Computer Literacy and Career Readiness. Their Pre-Apprenticeship Program offers core training in carpentry, electrical, plumbing, masonry, painting and weatherization.
Prince George's Community College	Team Builders Academy (TBA) is a Workforce Job-Training Program that includes Life-skills development, OSHA10, Communication-skill development (written and verbal), customer service skill development, workplace conduct, leadership skill development and empowerment.
Goodwill Industries of the Chesapeake	Goodwill's programs assist participants with basic job skills with a key focus on customer service, job search, conflict resolution and retention. Topics include, but are not limited to, ethics, self-determination, self-presentation, self-advocacy, social interaction, organization skill, money management and computer literacy.
Center For Urban Families	CFUF's programs include: proper workplace behavior, computer operation and basic skills in word processing, resume preparation, remedial math skills, interview strategies, job strategies and more. They also offer a Pre-Apprenticeship Program that covers a variety of topic including: safety training on power tools/hand tools and equipment, CAD, Plan reading, surveying and layout, exterior carpentry, interior carpentry, materials and fasteners.
Keller Professional Services	The KPS "Advantage Plus+" Soft Skills curriculum includes: professionalism and employer expectations, interest and barriers assessments, resume development, interviewing skills, building self-esteem and communication in the workplace.
Civic Works and Housing Builders Institute (HBI) Partnership	The Civic Works' program provides services that prepare students ages 16 to 18 years to graduate from high school with OSHA 10, First AID/CPR, and NCCER Core Curricula and Carpentry certifications. Students 17-24 years old, who have dropped out of high school and are currently unemployed or underemployed, receive construction education and learn hands-on construction skills by working alongside Habitat for Humanity of the Chesapeake and the Housing Authority of Baltimore City staff in renovating houses.
Ironworkers Local 5	Ironworkers Local #5's pre-apprentice program provides students with the initial knowledge and skills required to begin his/her first day as an apprenticeship Ironworker. Joint Apprentice Trainee Committee of Ironworker's Apprenticeship Program covers a variety of subjects such as: general overview of the trade, basic construction math, layout instruments, OSHA 30, subpart R, scaffold, forklift, first aid/CPR AED, fire watch, roadway flagger, structural aspects of the industry, rigging, glazing, blueprints and welding.
ABC Metro Washington Chapter	This program is designed to provide students with the knowledge and skills required in the construction trades in the areas of: basic safety, construction math, blueprint reading, material handling and employability skills. ABC Metro Washington also offers Apprenticeship Programs that guide apprentices through completion and obtaining journeyman status in carpentry, electrical, plumbing and ironwork.
Community Services Agency of Metropolitan Washington Council, AFL-CIO	CSA offers a training/job placement program where graduates earn certifications in OSHA 10, CPR, First Aid and Flagger Safety and Traffic Control, as well as a certification of completion from the Builders Futures Program.

Mid Atlantic Carpenters' Training Centers	MACTC's Pre-Apprenticeship Program is designed to teach basic carpentry skills and provide experiences in job readiness training. The Carpentry Apprenticeship Program is designed to teach comprehensive carpentry skills and provide extensive on-the-job training experiences by certifying Carpenters, Pile Drivers and Millwrights.
College of Southern Maryland	College of Southern Maryland offers an in-depth program that covers general construction and a NCCER Electricity Certification program.
Steamfitters Local 602	Steamfitters Local #602's Apprenticeship Program provides students with certifications in Universal CFC, OSHA 30, welding, medical gas installer/brazer, HVACR, pipefitting, Maryland Signalman & Rigger I/II Qualifications and Maryland, D.C. and Virginia Apprentices and Journeyman HVAC Licenses.
Plumbers & Pipefitters L.U. 5 Washington, DC	The Plumbers & Pipefitter's program allows students to learn all aspects of the plumbing and pipefitting trades both new construction, service and repairs, obtain their journeymen license in plumbing and natural gas and certifications in OSHA 30, medical gas installer and brazier, backflow, CPR and first aid, welding and green awareness.
Plumbers and Steamfitters Local 486	The Plumbers and Steamfitters' program will allow students to become a Maryland Licensed Journeyman Plumber and/or Journeyman HVACR, Licensed Backflow Preventer/Installer, Certified, Certified Welder, OSHA and First Aid and CPR. Additional training will include, medical gas installer/brazer, rigging and confined space.
