



**MINUTES OF THE
MARYLAND TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION
May 2, 2012**

The April meeting of the Maryland Transportation Commission (MTC) was held on May 2, 2012, at 10:30AM in the Board Room of the Maryland Department of Transportation. The following members were present.

Due to Vice Chairman VillaSanta's initial absence from the meeting while delayed due to construction traffic, the Commission unanimously nominated and voted Mr. Michael Moore to serve as the interim Vice Chair. Mr. Moore accepted and called the meeting to order at 10:53AM. Mr. VillaSanta asked Mr. Beam, staff to the Commission, if there were any dedication requests for presentation to the Commission.

Mr. Beam replied that there were two dedication requests to present to the Commission.

The first request was from the Office of the Lieutenant Governor, on behalf of Sergeant Anthony Michael "Tony" Walker (deceased), a 19 year veteran of the Prince George's County Police Department. Officer Walker lost his life while acting in his capacity as the President of the Prince George's County Fraternal Order of Police. The location requested is on MD 202 at Old Largo Road in the vicinity of the Prince George's County Fraternal Order of Police Lodge.

The MTC voted unanimously to respectfully table this request until June 6, 2012 as the supporting documentation requested was not produced during the meeting. [STAFF NOTE: MATERIAL WAS SUBSEQUENTLY RECEIVED DIRECTLY FOLLOWING THE MAY 2 MTC MEETING, AND THE REQUEST WAS APPROVED BY THE SECRETARY]

The second dedication request was from the Montgomery County Police Department (MCPD). MCPD Lieutenant Mark Sheelor and Corporal John Mullaney presented the request on behalf of MCPD Police Officer III (PO3) Luke Hoffman (deceased), who lost his life during a DWI arrest. The location requested is on MD 97, Georgia Avenue in the vicinity of Rossmoor Boulevard. Officer Hoffman was with the MCPD only 1 year, but had been recognized by his superiors as having the makings of an outstanding police officer.

The MTC voted unanimously to respectfully recommend approving this request contingent upon an additional letter of support. [STAFF NOTE: LETTER OF SUPPORT REQUESTED HAS BEEN RECEIVED.]

Hearing no other items of business, the Commission adjourned at 11:52AM until 10:30AM on May 2, 2012.
