

**AMENDMENT TO THE 2011 – 2014 BALTIMORE REGION
TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM**

WHEREAS, the Baltimore Regional Transportation Board (BRTB) is the designated Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Baltimore region, encompassing the Baltimore Urbanized Area, and includes official representatives of the cities of Annapolis and Baltimore, the counties of Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Carroll, Harford, and Howard, the Maryland Department of Transportation, the Maryland Department of the Environment, the Maryland Department of Planning, and the Maryland Transit Administration; and

WHEREAS, the Baltimore Regional Transportation Board, as the Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Baltimore region, approved the 2011-2014 Transportation Improvement Program for the Baltimore region at its July 27, 2010 meeting; and

WHEREAS, federal regulations require that all transportation-related projects must be listed in the approved Transportation Improvement Program with accurate funding schedules in order to be eligible for federal funding; and

WHEREAS, the Transportation Improvement Program consists of projects included in, and in support of, the region's long-range transportation plan and ongoing short-range planning efforts; and

WHEREAS, Howard County and the Maryland Transit Administration requested approval of amendments (see Attachment 1) to the 2011-2014 Transportation Improvement Program through the approved Transportation Improvement Program amendment process; and

WHEREAS, the Transportation Improvement Program, as amended, continues to display financial reasonableness and re-affirms the appropriate project selection criteria whereby all requirements for a Transportation Improvement Program in the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient, Transportation Equity, Act: A Legacy for Users are met; and

WHEREAS, the Interagency Consultation Group has determined that the Howard County project – including six bridge deck replacements – is exempt from the requirement to determine conformity according to the Conformity Rule (40 CFR Parts 51 and 93) and has also determined that the Maryland Transit Administration project – an

electric bus project for Howard County – is exempt from the requirement to determine conformity according to the Conformity Rule (40 CFR Parts 51 and 93); and


WHEREAS, both proposed TIP amendments were subject to a publicized 30-day public review with a public meeting on April 26, 2011, to allow for comments. A range of comments were received from both individuals and the CAC. After careful consideration, the BRTB has responded to the comments.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Baltimore Regional Transportation Board, as the Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Baltimore region, approves the attached amendment to the 2011-2014 Transportation Improvement Program for the Baltimore region and finds it to conform to the applicable Maryland State Implementation Plan and requirements of the 1990 Clean Air Act Amendments.

Howard County Electric Bus Related Comments

1.	No clear engineering data or justification for the expenditure.	Gus Williamson	<p>This is a demonstration project, and it is the first rollout in the US of this technology. As a demonstration project it is one of the highest priority projects that the FTA has designated in the TIGGER II program.</p> <p>Clearly, the bus is twice the cost of a diesel bus. However, the infrastructure cost is minimal and can be used on other vehicles utilizing inductive charging. If one were to purchase a CNG bus, for example, it would be 1.3 – 1.5 the cost of diesel with a \$1Million (or so) infrastructure cost. The additional cost is justified (clearly to the Federal government who is funding this) as this country needs to test advanced and very clean technologies. Assuming the vehicle is manufactured well, fuel use (and cost) will be ¼ of what it is on a diesel and maintenance costs will drop by 30% or more. There are no CO2 emissions on an electric bus.</p>
2.	<p>The CAC endorses the proposed TIP amendment conditional on the following provisions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Cost benefit analysis of first and life cycle costs of electric versus natural gas powered buses and their required support infrastructure shall be conducted. 2. Equipment considered for purchase and operation shall become the standard for equipment of this type for future purchases. 	CAC of the BRTB	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The cost/benefit as well as emissions and performance data will be collected and documented as part of this demonstration project. 2. Should this electric bus and inductive charger system prove to provide the benefits projected, it would become a standard for any bus system that moved in this direction.
