The Maryland Department of Transportation (MDOT) hereby amends the Fiscal Year (FY) 2019-2022 Maryland Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) for one new project in the FY 2019-2024 National Capital Region Transportation Planning Board (TPB) Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).

This amendment reflects the Maryland Department of Transportation Maryland Transit Administration's (MDOT MTA) federal discretionary grant award to replace diesel buses with advanced, heavy-duty zero-emission battery-electric buses on behalf of Frederick County. The TPB approved the amendment to its TIP on December 7, 2018 made a recent technical correction in the federal, state, and local split of the project funding. Both the original and updated TIP sheets are included. The MDOT has assigned Control #19-42 for this amendment to the STIP, and the approvals and supporting documentation are attached.

Description: TransIT Services of Frederick County (TSFC) in rural Maryland will replace three diesel buses that have exceeded their useful life with three advanced, heavy-duty BYD zero-emission battery-electric buses. TSFC intends to move toward an all-electric fleet, and this request will nearly double TSFC's fleet of battery-electric buses from 17 percent to 30 percent.

RESOLUTION ON AN AMENDMENT TO THE FY 2019-2024 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP) THAT IS EXEMPT FROM THE AIR QUALITY CONFORMITY REQUIREMENT TO INCLUDE FUNDING FOR THE LOW OR NO EMISSION GRANT PROGRAM, AS REQUESTED BY THE MARYLAND DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (MDOT) ON BEHALF OF FREDERICK COUNTY

WHEREAS, the National Capital Region Transportation Planning Board (TPB), which is the metropolitan planning organization (MPO) for the Washington Region, has the responsibility under the provisions of the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act for developing and carrying out a continuing, cooperative and comprehensive transportation planning process for the Metropolitan Area; and

WHEREAS, the TIP is required by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) as a basis and condition for all federal funding assistance to state, local and regional agencies for transportation improvements within the Washington planning area; and

WHEREAS, on October 17, 2018 the TPB adopted the FY 2019-2024 TIP; and

WHEREAS, in the attached letter of November 29, 2018 MDOT has requested on behalf of Frederick County that the FY 2019-2024 TIP be amended to include \$1.765 million in FTA Section 5339(c) funding for the Low or No Emission Grant Program (TIP ID 6666) in FY 2019 to replace three diesel buses in Frederick County with three zero-emission electric buses, as described in the attached materials; and

WHEREAS, this project is exempt from the air quality conformity requirement, as defined in Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) Transportation Conformity Regulations as of April 2012;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Steering Committee of the National Capital Region Transportation Planning Board amends the FY 2019-2024 TIP to include \$1.765 million in FTA Section 5339(c) funding for the Low or No Emission Grant Program (TIP ID 6666) in FY 2019, as described in the attached materials.

MDOT MTA is requesting an amendment to the FY 2019-2022 WashCOG/TPB TIP. FTA has awarded MDOT MTA a discretionary grant on behalf of Frederick County as part of the Low or No Emission Grant Program (Lo-No Program; Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA) number: 20.526).

MDOT MTA will increase federal obligation for Section 5339 funding in the amount of \$1.5M. This source of funding will be used to purchase three (3) advanced, heavy-duty BYD zero-emission battery-electric buses. These buses will replace three (3) diesel buses that have exceeded their useful life.

The proposed action will not impact scheduling or funding availability for other projects in the current TIP, which continues to be fiscally constrained.
