The Maryland Department of Transportation (MDOT) hereby amends the Fiscal Year (FY) 2019 – 2022 Maryland Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) to reflect the following amendments to the rural highway portion of the FY 2019 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). The MDOT has designated this amendment as Control #19-138, and the supporting documentation is attached.

This requested amendment, MD 90 Corridor Study (WO7821) reflects the addition of a new project, WO7821, to the FY 2019-2022 Maryland STIP and \$287,000 to FY 2019-2022 Maryland STIP planning funding for this project. PURPOSE OF MEMORANDUM

The MDOT State Highway Administration (MDOT SHA) hereby requests amendment of the FY 2019-2022 Maryland STIP to reflect the following one action.

ANALYSIS

MD 90 Corridor Study (W07821) – This requested amendment reflects the addition of a new project, W07821, to the FY 2019-2022 Maryland STIP and \$287,000 to FY 2019-2022 Maryland STIP planning funding for this project. The MDOT SHA requests this amendment in order that the FY 2019-2022 Maryland STIP reflects MDOT SHA's updated programmed project expenditures and project schedule in FY 2019-2022. (This project and funding programmed beyond FY 2022 also will be included in the forthcoming FY 2022-2025 Maryland STIP, submission of which is anticipated in October 2021.) This pre-NEPA planning activity will begin in Fall 2021 and proceed through 2022.

The attached STIP report documents MDOT's requested amendment with respect to funding for the above project. This requested action will not impact scheduling or funding availability for other projects in the current STIP, which remains fiscally constrained. The amended funding does not affect the portion of federal funding programmed for transit or allocations of state aid to local jurisdictions in lieu of federal aid.

In addition, the Maryland Transportation Trust Fund (TTF) remains fiscally constrained. The TTF supports State transportation system operation and maintenance, MDOT administration, debt service, and capital projects. Semiannually, MDOT updates revenues and expenditures using two national forecasting companies' latest economic estimates. The MDOT published funding details in the FY 2021-2026 Consolidated Transportation Program (http://www.mdot.maryland.gov/newMDOT/Planning/CTP/ Index.html) and FY 2019-2022 Maryland STIP (http://www.mdot.maryland.gov/newMDOT/Planning/STIP TIP/STIPandTIP.html).
