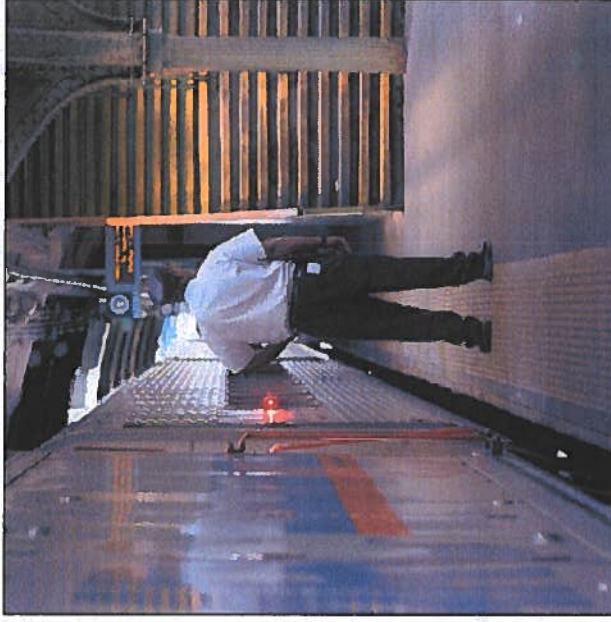

Administrative Modification: This administrative modification updates FTA Section 5337 funds to reflect FY 2020 funds not originally accounted for during the FY 2020-2023 TIP call for projects. These funds will be used to procure and begin construction of the Riverside heavy maintenance facility and to fund repairs and renovations at the MARC BWI facility. Funds increase in the amount of \$7.8 million federal along with \$1.95 million in matching funds. Total funding in the TIP increases from \$80.919 million to \$90.669 million.

MDOT MTA is requesting an administrative modification to the FY 2020-2023 BMC/BRTB TIP for MARC Facilities, TIP ID # 70-1503-55.

MDOT MTA will be adding \$7.8M in Section 5337 State of Good Repair Funding in FY20—an amount that was not originally accounted for during the FY 2020-2023 Call for Projects. MDOT MTA will utilize this funding to procure and begin construction of the Riverside Heavy Maintenance Facility, as well as to fund repairs and renovations to the MARC BWI Facility.

The proposed action will not impact scheduling or funding availability for other projects in the current TIP, which continues to be fiscally constrained.
