The Maryland Department of Transportation (MDOT) requested approval of an Amendment to the FY 2019 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) (Control #19-53 dated March 24, 2020). This Amendment includes the purchase of four battery electric buses and four charging stations for Prince George's County in the amount of \$2.2M Federal (\$2.75M Total) through FTA's Section 5339c Low or No Emission Grants (Low-No) discretionary program. This new project (ID# 6713) will support the National Capital Region Transportation Planning Board (TPB) area.

Per agreement, a joint Federal Transit Administration (FTA)/Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) approval of this STIP Amendment is not required. Based on our review of the information provided, the FTA hereby approves this Amendment to the STIP and finds it consistent with the requirements of 23 U.S.C. 135 and 49 U.S.C. 5304. This approval does not constitute an obligation of Federal funds. FTA finalizes Federal funding for projects included in the STIP upon approval of a grant application.
