The Maryland Department of Transportation (MDOT) hereby submits an Amendment to the Fiscal Year (FY) 2019 Maryland Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) to reflect changes to the highway portion of the WILMAPCO FY 2020-2023 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).
