

Description:

The project will replace bridge no. 12066 over Tollgate Road and bridge no. 12065 over Winters Run along US 1 in Bel Air. The bridge over Tollgate Road will maintain three 12-foot lanes with a 10' 6" shoulder on each side of the roadway. The bridge over Winters Run will maintain two 12-foot lanes with a 10' shoulder on one side of the roadway and a 19' 6" shoulder on the other side.

Justification:


The existing bridges, built in 1963, are rated in poor condition.

Amendment: This amendment adds a new project to the 2021-2024 TIP. MDOT SHA is converting funding for engineering from state to federal funding, necessitating the inclusion of the project in the 2021-2024 TIP. The amendment adds \$1.31 million (\$.332 million federal/\$.978 million matching) in engineering funds and \$5.168 million (\$4.886 million federal/\$.282 million matching) in construction funds. The estimated total cost of the project is \$15.35 million, with funding continuing beyond the timeframe covered by the TIP.

ANALYSIS

US 1 Tollgate Road and Winters Run Bridges Replacement (BRTB 65-2101-13) – This requested amendment reflects the addition of a new project to the FY 2021-2024 BRTB TIP, the addition of \$1,310,000 to FY 2021-2024 BRTB TIP design funding, and the addition of \$5,168,000 to FY 2021-2024 BRTB TIP construction funding. This project will replace two poor-rated bridges built in 1963. The MDOT SHA anticipates a total project cost of approximately \$15 million. The MDOT SHA is converting design for this project from State-funded to federally-funded, prompting this amendment. Following design, MDOT SHA anticipates construction in 2023-2025.

The attached Statewide TIP (STIP) report documents MDOT's requested amendment with respect to funding for the above project. This requested action will not impact scheduling or funding availability for other projects in the current STIP, which remains fiscally constrained. The amended funding does not affect the portion of federal funding programmed for transit or allocations of state aid to local jurisdictions in lieu of federal aid.

In addition, the Maryland Transportation Trust Fund (TTF) remains fiscally constrained. The TTF supports State transportation system operation and maintenance, MDOT administration, debt service, and capital projects. Semiannually, MDOT updates revenues and expenditures using two national forecasting companies' latest economic estimates. The MDOT published funding details in the FY 2020-2025 Consolidated Transportation Program (http://www.mdot.maryland.gov/newMDOT/Planning/CTP/Index.html) and FY 2019-2022 Maryland STIP (http://www.mdot.maryland.gov/newMDOT/Planning/STIP_TIP/STIPandTIP.html).
