#### PURPOSE OF MEMORANDUM

To request the MDOT Office of Planning and Capital Programming approve and forward to C-SMMPO for its approval the following TIP amendment.

#### **SUMMARY**

The MDOT State Highway Administration (MDOT SHA) hereby requests amendment of the FY 2021-2024 C-SMMPO TIP to reflect the following action.

#### **ANALYSIS**

MD 5 Great Mills Study (C-SMMPO S-2018-08 MC #19-64 06/23/2020) – This requested amendment reflects the addition of \$1,242,000 to FY 2021-2024 C-SMMPO TIP funding for S-2018-08 MC #19-64 06/23/2020. The MDOT SHA requests this amendment, which primarily shifts previously programmed funds, in order that the FY 2021-2024 C-SMMPO TIP reflects MDOT SHA's updated programmed project expenditures and project schedule in FY 2021-2024. This project's total estimated cost, including for years prior to, during, and beyond the FY 2021-2024 C-SMMPO TIP, is decreasing from \$33 million to \$28 million. If construction funding is identified, MDOT SHA anticipates advertising this project for construction in the Winter of 2023-2024.

The attached Statewide TIP (STIP) report documents MDOT's requested amendment with respect to funding for the above project. This requested action will not impact scheduling or funding availability for other projects in the current STIP, which remains fiscally constrained. The amended funding does not affect the portion of federal funding programmed for transit or allocations of state aid to local jurisdictions in lieu of federal aid.

In addition, the Maryland Transportation Trust Fund (TTF) remains fiscally constrained. The TTF supports State transportation system operation and maintenance, MDOT administration, debt service, and capital projects. Semiannually, MDOT updates revenues and expenditures using two national forecasting companies' latest economic estimates. The MDOT published funding details in the FY 2020-2025 Consolidated Transportation Program (http://www.mdot.maryland.gov/newMDOT/Planning/CTP/Index.html) and FY 2021-2024 Maryland STIP (http://www.mdot.maryland.gov/newMDOT/Planning/STIP\_TIP/STIPandTIP.html).
